

ZERO TOLERANCE PROGRAM FAQs

Pursuant to KRS 189A.010(1)(f), the DUI legislation includes a provision for substance abuse services for young adults under 21 charged with operating a vehicle with a .02 to .08 blood alcohol concentration. The regulation requires that these services be provided through a licensed prevention agency. Bluegrass Prevention Center, a program of bluegrass.org, is the agency licensed to provide these services throughout the 17 counties of Central Kentucky.

- ◆ In order to accommodate the court's requirement for completion of the service within a 90 day period, individuals should be required to contact Bluegrass Prevention Center within 10 days of their conviction of **KRS 189A.010(1)(f)**.
- ◆ Upon contacting Bluegrass Prevention Center, the individual will be scheduled to attend the next available assessment date to determine the extent of their alcohol/drug use. If the assessment scores indicate a low probability of a substance abuse or dependency disorder, the participant is required to complete 15 hours of alcohol/drug education. If a high probability is indicated, the participant will be recommended for further assessment for treatment services. ***There is a fee for the assessment and education classes.***
- ◆ Offenders who do not attend services; fail to pay the required fees; or do not comply with the program's written rules of participation will be discharged from services. If they are discharged, the sentencing court shall be notified by Bluegrass Prevention Center within a 3-day period so as to provide adequate time for placing the offender on the docket for contempt of court charges.

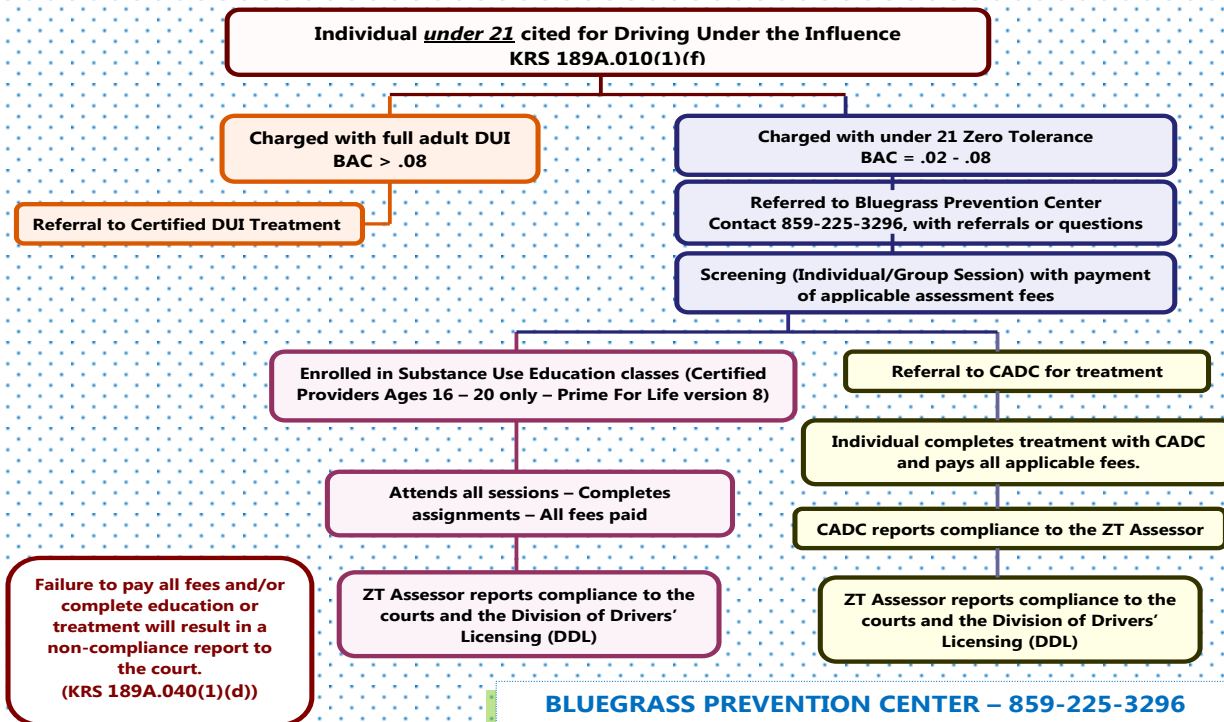
