

**CITY OF LYNDON, KENTUCKY
ORDINANCE #1-20-98; SERIES 1997-98**

**AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO TRAINING REQUIREMENTS
FOR SELLERS AND SERVERS OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES
WITHIN THE CITY OF LYNDON**

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Kentucky Alcohol Beverage Control statues and regulations set out in KRS Chapters 241 to 244 and KAR Chapters 1 to 11, it is the intent of the City of Lyndon to:

- (1) Eliminate the sale of alcoholic beverages to underage persons;
- (2) Reduce intoxication-related accidents, injuries, and deaths;
- (3) Encourage alcoholic beverage retailers to be prudent in their serving practices;
- (4) Encourage alcoholic beverage retailers to implement responsible policies for serving and promoting alcoholic beverages to customers and prevent the over-consumption of alcoholic beverages by customers while on the licensed premises of retailers; and
- (5) Promote an attitude of professionalism and responsibility on the part of retailers who sell or serve alcoholic beverages which is expressed in a commitment to responsible services,

AND, WHEREAS, the requirement of all businesses to participate in a training program for all those who are servers and sellers of alcoholic beverages (certified by the Alcohol Beverage Control Authority) will facilitate these goals,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF LYNDON,
KENTUCKY:

SECTION 1: Creation and Membership

Beginning July 1, 1998, and thereafter, all sellers and retailers of alcoholic beverages, as defined in KRS Chapters 241 to 244 and KAR Chapters 1 to 11, in the City of Lyndon must be certified in the training program established and certified by the local ABC Authority, or one approved through the local ABC authority. It is the responsibility of the above-defined seller or retailer to insure employees who handle the sale and service of alcoholic beverages maintain certification. Newly hired personnel will be given 45 days to obtain their certification. Persons successfully completing the training program will be given a picture identification card. Certification shall be renewed every two (2) years from the date of program completion. Certification for the sellers or retailers shall be as follows:

- (1) Those sellers or retailers holding only a retail beer or package liquor license where no alcoholic beverages will be consumed on the premises must have at least one certified person on the premises at all times to be responsible for all sales of alcoholic beverages.
- (2) Those with any additional liquor sales license must certify each and every person who shall be serving or dispensing alcoholic beverages to the public.

Section 2: Responsible Party

Each seller or retailer shall, at the time of applying for its liquor license, designate in writing a Kentucky resident who shall be responsible for compliance with this ordinance.

SECTION 2: COMPLIANCE

The local ABC Officer, in accordance with his or her duties of enforcement under KRS Statutes and KAR regulation, may take into consideration that the seller or retailer is in full compliance with all requirements hereunder.

SECTION 3: PENALTY

Any seller or retailer defined above in violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of at least \$100.00, but not more than \$500.00 for each violation. Each day of non-compliance shall be considered a separate offense.

SECTION 4: EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by law.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE #1-20-98, SERIES 1997-98
PERTAINING TO TRAINING REQUIREMENTS FOR SELLERS AND
SERVERS OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS**

WHEREAS, on February 16, 1998, the Lyndon City Council adopted Ordinance #1-20-98 relating to training requirements for sellers and servers of alcoholic beverages within the city limits; and

WHEREAS, the Lyndon City Council finds it necessary to amend Ordinance #1-20-98 to reflect these changes:

Section 1: Creation and Membership

~~Persons successfully completing the training program will be given a picture identification card.~~ Certification shall be renewed every two (2) years three (3) years from the date of program completion.

Section 2: This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.
