Update on Heyburn Ruling	Karen reported that the grocers have filed a motion for a re-hearing on the Heyburn Ruling for the entire court to hear. The Justice has made their decision on evidence and not fact. They were never argued in the court and that was the reason for the re-hearing. It is rare to get a hearing in front of the full appeals court. If granted a re-hearing, both sides would appear. We expect to hear something in the next month or so from the court. Kentucky Teen Institute (KIT) Presentation	<p>Ben Reno-Weber, CEO of the KY YMCA Youth Association shared a presentation on the Kentucky Teen Institute (KIT). This program develops the leadership capacity of teens to lead the way to greater health in our Commonwealth. Teams of young people from across the state are trained to implement health initiatives in their communities and transform themselves in the process. Through leadership training and supportive adult partnerships, KIT empowers young people to implement community based programs and youth-led initiatives. Ben is working on a way to create partnerships with different organizations for support of this program and trying to get away from the program being totally grant funded. They are looking for sponsors as a whole. Legislative Session Update	<p>Sherry Bray at Kentucky State Police has asked for any information we can provide to prevent legislation in Kentucky for medical marijuana. Marilyn reported that a packet of information has been sent out to all of the RPC's. What we need from communities is support and encourages them to call their legislators with facts.</p> <p>HB-34 David Warner held a press conference and met with three legislators dealing with increasing the look back period for DUI convicted offenders from five to ten years. 2012 Governor's Alcohol Task Force	<p>Darryl inquired about the 2012 Governor's Alcohol Task Force. There were several items tabled and no one has mentioned moving forward with getting the Task Force back together. Tiffany reported that ABC's intention was to wait until after the Legislative Session and ask them to re-convene to discuss a Statewide mandate for Responsible Beverage Server (RBS) Training.</p> <p>It was discussed that KAPA may want to address this issue by writing letters to request that the Governor's Task Force be put back together. 2014 KAPA Day at the Capitol	<p>Donna Wiesenahn informed the group KAPA Day at the Capitol and Lunch with the KY Legislators will occur on Thursday, February 27, 2014, and encouraged KAPA members to attend and invite their local youth coalitions.</p> <p><u>DAY AT THE CAPITOL OBJECTIVES:</u></p> <p>Donna and Marilyn Rodgers discussed the KAPA Day at the Capitol primary objectives, and reminded everyone to talk to legislators about what they were comfortable on. Objectives mentioned were to inform legislators:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Who KAPA is, and what types of resources and data we can bring to the table. For example, if there is another Governor’s ABC Task Force we want to make sure prevention has a seat at the table. 2. What prevention means.... It’s more than just individual, it’s environmental 3. What prevention has accomplished... Where we’ve been, because preventing alcohol use before it starts saves money and saves lives 4. Yet... despite these accomplishments, alcohol is still Kentucky’s #1 youth drug problem 5.
