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Keg Registration Ordinances



Keg Registration requires wholesalers or retailers to attach a tag, sticker, or engraving with an identification number to kegs exceeding a specified capacity. These ID tags may aid law enforcement in efforts such as the location where the keg is to be consumed and the tag number of the vehicle used to transport the keg. Some jurisdictions also require retailers to provide warning information at the time of purchase about laws prohibiting providing alcohol to minors.

At purchase, the retailer records identifying information about the purchaser (e.g., name, address, telephone number, driver's license). A refundable deposit may also be collected for the keg itself, the tapper mechanism used to serve the beer, or both. The deposit is refunded when the keg and/or tapper are returned with the identification number intact.

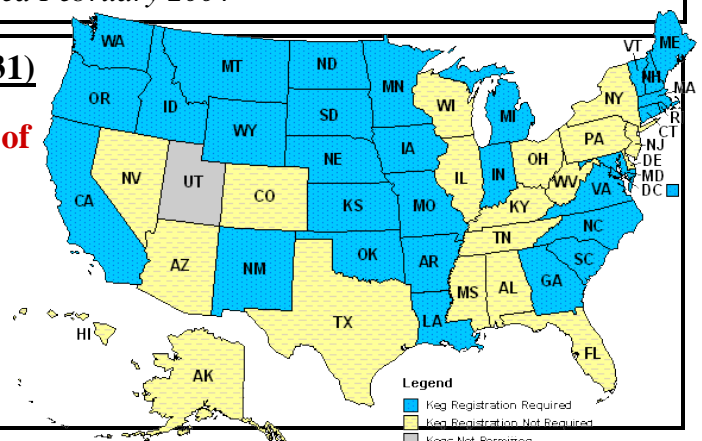


States with Keg Registration Laws as of Jan. 2014 (31)
