<u>HB 300</u> <u>(BR-154)</u>	AN ACT relating to alcoholic beverage control. (Governor’s Task Force on Alcohol Laws: Medical Amnesty & Disorderly Premises)	2nd reading (S) PASSED 67-28 (H)
<u>HB 310</u> <u>(BR-1321)</u>	AN ACT relating to underage access to alcoholic beverages. (Licensees may not allow minors to enter premises selling malt beverages, distilled spirits, or wine, unless w/ parent/guardian. Exempt current licensees)	Judiciary (H)
<u>HB 327</u> <u>(BR-1457)</u>	AN ACT relating to alcoholic beverages. (Change retail package liquor license ratio in counties containing a city of the first class from 1 for every 1,500 people to 1 for every 2,300 people. Exempt current licensees)	L&O (H)
<u>HB 28</u> <u>(BR-159)</u>	AN ACT relating to shock probation. (Prohibit Shock Probation if convicted of manslaughter 2 nd -degree or reckless homicide and DUI in same incident)	Judiciary (H)
<u>HB 32</u> <u>(BR-17)</u>	AN ACT relating to driving under the influence. (Expand look-back window for prior DUI convictions from 5-years to 10-years. Allow forfeiture of vehicle used in DUI if operator’s license had been previously suspended)	Judiciary (H)
<u>HB 286</u> <u>(BR-330)</u>	AN ACT relating to driving under the influence. (Replace current hardship license w/ ignition interlock licensing system for all DUI Conviction)	Judiciary (H)
<u>HB 221</u> <u>(BR-428)</u>	AN ACT relating to local option elections. (Exempt listed projects/ districts from precinct vote in favor of prohibition if precinct is within qualifying city)	Governor signed into LAW PASSED (H) 95-5 PASSED (S) 29-6
<u>SB 13</u> <u>(BR-84)</u>	AN ACT relating to the sale of alcoholic beverages on election days. (Permit the sale of distilled spirits and wine on any primary, or regular, local option, or special election day). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ HFA3 includes recommendations from the 2012 Governor’s Task Force on Alcohol Laws, and creates a new section of KRS 244 to establish medical amnesty for minors reporting an alcohol overdose, and amends KRS 244 related to disorderly premises. ▪ Medical Amnesty, per Heather Parrino from the BRICC Coalition and University of Louisville, a university with a Good Samaritan Policy, “...is meant to encourage minors to seek emergency medical attention, several universities have created policies and several states have enacted statutes, which confer limited immunity from criminal prosecution for certain crimes when emergency medical attention is needed because of alcohol consumption. Such statutes are known as Medical Amnesty or Good Samaritan laws.” 	Governor signed into LAW 04/04/13 PASSED 50-46 w/ HFA3 & HFA4 (H) PASSED 27-11 w/ HFA3 & HFA4 (S)
<u>SB 142</u> <u>(BR-1417)</u>	AN ACT relating to elections. (Require petitions for local option elections to contain legibly printed names; change date of birth to year of birth; and delete SS# requirement. Require local option elections held on the same day as a primary or regular election)	Elections, Const. Amendments & Intergovernmental Affairs (H) PASSED 34-1 (S)
